In Sanskrit, a nāgá is a cobra, the Indian cobra (Naja naja). A synonym for nāgá is phaṇin (फ़ाणिन). There are several words for "snake" in general, and one of the very commonly used ones is sarpá (सर्पा). Sometimes the word nāgá is also used generically to mean "snake". The word is cognate with English 'snake', Germanic: \*snēk-a-, Proto-IE: \*(s)nēg-o- (with s-mobile).
